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ister Laura Jean has ministered as a formal educator in rural, inner city, and faraway places; educating for justice at provincial and international levels; facilitating spiritual development through directing renewal programs, retreats, and prayer days; and 16 years of congregational leadership which found her experiencing SSND in at least 25 different countries. Through all of these rich immersions, she developed a global heart and feels herself to be, first and above all, a world citizen. Ministry locations in Wisconsin included: St. Leo, St. Anne and the Archdiocesan Justice and Peace Office in Milwaukee; St. Francis Xavier in Superior; and the SSND Provincial Offices in Milwaukee and Elm Grove. She served at the SSND Generalate in Rome as a resource person from 1982-1985 and was elected to two terms on the General Council from 1998-2008. Following a sabbatical, she served as campus minister for three years at the Newman Center in Rolla, Mo. She is currently ministering in the Diocese of Jefferson City, Mo. as a spiritual companion and prayer facilitator. Sister Laura Jean earned a bachelor's in sociology and English from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee and a master's in theology and spirituality from Regis College in Toronto.
