ister Annabelle spent her first 40 years as a professed religious in the teaching field. One exception during that time was eight months in CPE and pastoral care at Abbot Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis, Minnesota. This experience gave her a whole different view of working with children. She worked with students at the junior high level and also was the administrator in elementary schools 15 of those years. Sister Annabelle was the motherhouse administrator at Good Counsel for eight years. In 1993, she began 13 years of pastoral ministry at Nativity Parish in St. Paul, Minnesota. After four years working part-time as a receptionist at a funeral home in St. Paul, Sister Annabelle eased into retirement and moved to Good Counsel in 2010.

My SSND sister, Valeria, and I came to know and love these impoverished people and we became a strong moral support in their many needs. We were able to generate some meager funds, to provide some needed clothing and obtain school supplies for the children. As they struggled with learning in a new language, we became one-on-one tutors and helped bring forward their hidden talents. We also assisted in the children's sacramental preparations. It was awesome to witness the parents' faith, and to observe how they imparted Christian values to each child. Valeria and I were extremely blessed to have the opportunity to mentor and minister to them.

I was drawn to SSND through my close family connections to the congregation for several generations. My great aunt, two aunts, and many of my first cousins are SSNDs, plus two of my blood sisters. I was educated by SSNDs both in grade and high school. Four girls in my immediate family are graduates of Good Counsel Academy.
