Next, she shifted her ministry to college, directing early childhood education and teaching children's literature for 27 years at St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wisconsin. She was a guest professor at Boston College, the University of Kansas, the University of Dilimon in Manila and the College of Notre Dame in Kyoto. In 2005, she was elected to a six-year leadership term for SSND's Milwaukee Province. Sister Mary Alyce received a bachelor's in English with minors in history, sociology and religion from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee; a master's in guidance, counseling and English from Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa; and a Ph.D. in early childhood and children's literature from The Ohio State University in Columbus. Currently, she is in Brakel, Germany where she is researching and writing on Frances (nee Huber) Gerhardinger, mother of Blessed Theresa of Jesus Gerhardinger, foundress of the School Sisters of Notre Dame.
