Sister Thelma was first called by God to teach intermediate and junior high students in North Dakota, Iowa, Washington, and Minnesota. In 1959 she began a 14-year stint as a teacherladministrator in four different schools. After a semester of spiritual renewal in 1981, Sister Thelma did some teaching plus work as a school librarian. With a move to Holy Childhood in St. Paul in 1985 she began a ministry to the elderly that extended through the next 26 years. This joy-filled work gradually evolved into retirement of prayer and presence.
