Sister Mary Anne's early ministries encompassed 12 years in teaching middle school in the Minnesota communities of Mankato, Buffalo and Hokah. From 1979-1985, she focused on Catholic Charismatic Renewal in North Mankato, followed by nine years' service in pastoral care at St. Joseph Hospital in Mankato. Following three years of service in pastoral care at the Good Counsel Convent nursing home, she began a new focus in adult faith formation at two Burnsville, Minnesota, parishes. Since 2009, she has worked as a pastoral associate at Holy Rosary parish in North Mankato. She earned a bachelor's in social science at Mount Mary College in Milwaukee and a master's in religious studies from St. Louis University.
