Sister Mary Ruth's first decade of ministry as a teacher took her to Knoxville, Iowa; Jefferson City and Linn, Missouri; and finally to St. Louis, where she taught middle grade school students from 1971-1976. She followed her calling to Loose Creek, Missouri, teaching at Immaculate Conception for the next eight years. Following several years in teaching and administration in Lawrence, Nebraska, she returned to Missouri. From the late 1980s through the eve of the new millennium, she ministered in elementary education and administration in the towns of Hannibal, Marceline and Martinsburg, all in the Jefferson City diocese. Since 1999, she has worked as a pastoral minister at Annunciation Parish in California, Missouri. She earned a bachelor's in music theory from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis and a master's in elementary administration from Clarke College in Dubuque, Iowa.
