# Phyllis Marie Grzeczka, SSND 50 Years

In 1978, she returned to her hometown in Michigan, continuing her ministries in the communities of Grand Rapids, Bad Axe and Bay City. From 1985-1998, she served as a parish liturgist in the Wisconsin towns of Little Chute, Clintonville, Green Bay and Lake Geneva. She was called to Christ King Parish in South Bend, Indiana, where she ministered through 2005. She was elected to a six-year term as provincial councilor, serving in Elm Grove. Currently Sister Phyllis Marie serves as liturgist and parish musician at Siena Center on the Lake in Racine, Wisconsin. She holds a bachelor's in music education from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee and a master's in religious education from Aquinas College in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

#### A blessing of these years I want to share is ...

I found that each call had its own blessing and challenge. My early years as music educator gave me the opportunity to work with all ages from K-12. Being part of the Vatican II changes was exciting, with all the renewal it brought to the local church, and especially to religious life.
