ister Laurine Anne served as a teacher for 15 years in the Wisconsin towns of Milwaukee, Freedom and Menasha. Following several years of study and a period of renewal, she resumed her teaching ministry in Marinette, Wisconsin from 1972-1973. She served two years as supervisor of schools for the Diocese of Marquette in Michigan, then returned to Wisconsin to serve the SSND community in Elm Grove and Mequon. From 1980-1987, she worked as a nurse's aide and in administrative roles for Elm Grove's Notre Dame Health Care Center. Beginning in 1988, she volunteered for eight years at Milwaukee's Casa Maria, a Catholic Worker community welcoming homeless women and families. She then turned her focus to serving those with mental health challenges. Between 2004-2009, she worked in Milwaukee, ministering to children living with HIV. Since 2009 she has served in prayer and presence at Notre Dame of Elm Grove. She received a bachelor's in sociology from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee and a doctorate in administration from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.
