Beginning in 1945, she served on staff at Mankato's Good Counsel Convent for three years. From 1948-1963, she answered the call to the Minnesota communities of St. Leo, Northfield, Winona and St. Paul. After a three-year assignment in New England, North Dakota, she returned to Winona and St. Paul, working in pastoral ministry at Our Lady of Guadalupe from 1975-1981. For 15+ years she dedicated her ministry to providing in-home care and comfort for the elderly in New Prague, Minnesota. Beginning in 2000, she joined the community of sisters living at Mankato's Good Counsel Convent, where she continues to reside in presence and prayer.
