Sister Ruth's early ministries in teaching took her to the Missouri cities of St. Louis and Jefferson City, as well as to Conway, Arkansas. From 1967-1978, she served as a professor and administrator at Nanzan University in Nagoya, Japan. She returned to a six-year assignment as director of the Maria Center in St. Louis, followed by three years in special education. She worked in administration at Mount Mary College in Milwaukee from 1987-1995. She returned to St. Louis, working as a food services director for nine years. She continued part-time ministries for the SSND of the Theresa Center at the Sancta Maria in Ripa campus. She received a bachelor's in chemistry from Webster College in St. Louis and both a master's and doctorate in philosophy from the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana.
