Sister Ann followed her first profession in 1957 in the ministry of elementary education in Mobile, Alabama, and several schools in the Diocese of Jefferson City, Missouri. From there she taught in Herrin, Illinois. Returning to St. Louis, she continued her elementary teaching in various schools in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. In addition to all of her teaching experiences, she served as parish liturgist. She also served in the capacity of director of religious education in Sikeston, Missouri. Following her teaching and parish ministries, Sister Ann dedicated eight years of service to the St. Louis Motherhouse as secretary to the administration. After her sabbatical in Louisiana, she served as a receptionist for Kelly Services in St. Louis. She held several more positions as an administrative assistant around the St. Louis area, including at the Immigrant and Refugee Women's Program, St. Louis University and St. Louis Consultation Center. In 2006, she accepted a position with the Catholic Education Office of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which she held through 2011. Since 2011, she has ministered in various volunteer services such as the English Tutoring Project and Feed My People, and enjoys prayerful presence and witness through these volunteer services. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in music theory from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis, and a Master of Education Administration from St. Louis University.
