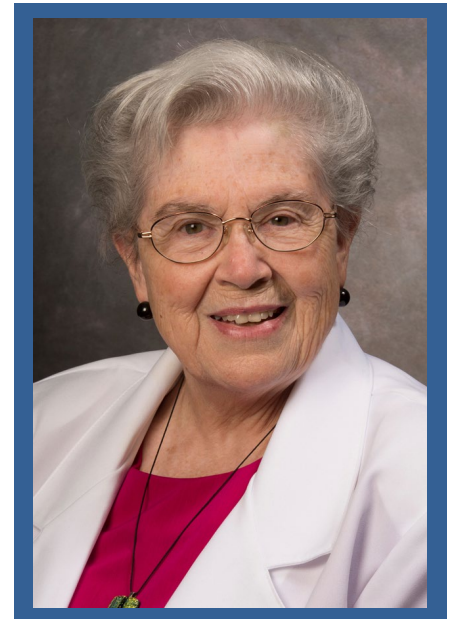

Sister Judy Corrigan, SSND

Sister Judy served as an elementary and high school teacher in the Midwest and in California, at Duchesne in St. Charles, Missouri, and at Academy of Notre Dame in Belleville, Illinois, during her first 12 years of ministry. Beginning in 1972, she taught at Notre Dame High School in St. Louis for 11 years. She turned to ministry as a development director, serving at Our Lady of Angels Franciscan Seminary, where she was academic dean, director of development and spiritual advisor. Following that ministry, Sister Judy served the Franciscan Friars at Franciscan Charities. In 1997, Sister Judy accepted a role as grant writer for the Sisters of Divine Providence. In 1999, she was hired as coordinator of volunteers for that order's Room at the Inn shelter program. In 2005, her ministry took her to healthcare, where she served as a patient ambassador for St. Louis University Hospital. Since 2011, she has continued to volunteer there and commit herself to prayer and presence for the SSND community in St. Louis. She holds a bachelor's and master's in English, earned from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis and St. Louis University, respectively.
