Sister Mary Ann Williams, SSND

Sister Mary Ann taught in Catholic grade schools around the Dioceses of New Ulm, St. Paul/Minneapolis and Dubuque, Iowa, for the first 16 years following her initial profession in 1957. The 1970s brought her several new roles in elementary education administration and adult education in Gary, Indiana. Sister Mary Ann turned to pastoral care in hospitals, serving at St. Vincent Hospital in Indianapolis from 1981 through 1989, followed by four years at St. Vincent Hospital in Carmel, Indiana. Following several years of additional studies and interim ministries in California's Oakland Diocese, she served from 2003 through 2011 as assistant to the motherhouse administrator of the Presentation Sisters in San Francisco. Since 2011, she has resided in St. Paul serving as a pastoral care minister at Holy Childhood Church, as well as in prayer and presence with the community. She holds a bachelor's in history with a minor in English from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. In 1975, she earned a master's in education and elementary administration from the University of Colorado-Greeley.
