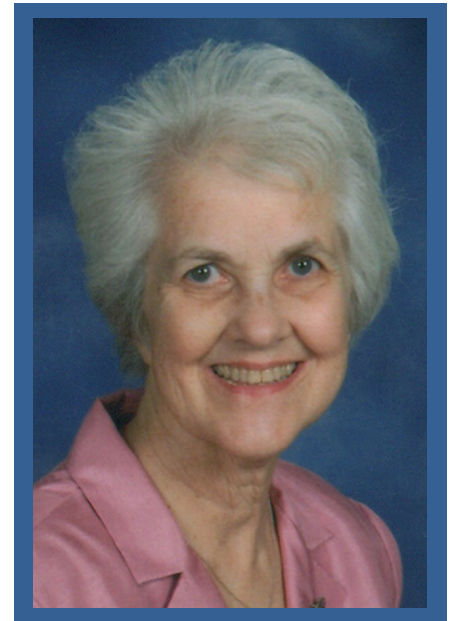

Sister Patricia spent her first decade of teaching ministry at Our Lady of Sorrows grade school in St. Louis. After a five-year post in administration at St. Francis Solanus in Quincy, Illinois, she returned to Our Lady of Sorrows to serve in administration. Following two more teaching posts, at St. Dominic in Breese, Illinois, and St. Hilary in Pico Rivera, California, she settled in Illinois in 1984, where she worked as assistant superintendent of schools for the Diocese of Belleville in Illinois. The new millennium brought a new call, which Sister Patricia answered by serving as a provincial councilor for the former St. Louis Province from 1999 through 2007. Following a two-year post as an adjunct consultant for Catholic School Management, she returned to the Belleville Diocese where she now serves in prayer, presence and as a volunteer in and around Shiloh. She graduated in 1969 with a bachelor's in sociology from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis, and holds a master's in elementary administration from St. Louis University.
