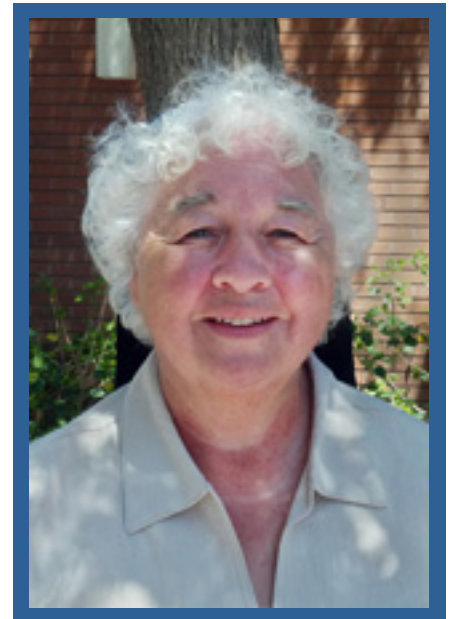

Sister Cecilia Marie spent her first decade of ministry teaching grade school students at St. Matthew and St. Anne schools, in St. Paul and Wabasso, Minnesota. Following a two-year assignment in the Diocese of Dubuque, Iowa, she returned to Minnesota as teacher and administrator at All Saints in Madison Lake. Beginning in 1987, she spent a decade teaching at St. Mary in Caledonia, in the Diocese of Winona. Answering a call to move to the Southwest, she served as a teacher for two years in New Mexico, followed by an eight-year post at Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Glendale, Arizona. Sister Cecilia Marie continued teaching in the Phoenix diocese through 2017, including eight years at St. Vincent dePaul. Currently, she is employed as a full-time teacher, tutoring 4-8th grades in math and reading at St. Louis the King Catholic School in Glendale. She holds a bachelor's in elementary education from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee, and later earned a master's in language arts from Clarke College in Dubuque.
