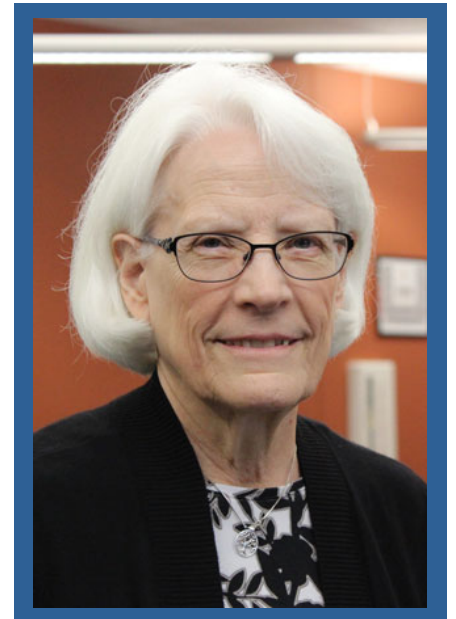

Sister Mary Willette, SSND

Sister Mary began her ministry teaching music and general education classes to elementary and middle school students around the Winona diocese in Minnesota. Schools included: St. Casimir in Wells, St. Mary in Worthington and St. Stanislaus in Winona. She then served as the chair for the Winona Diocesan Liturgy Commission and liturgist for the Cathedral Parish. Returning to the classroom in 1978, Sister Mary continued teaching through 2001. These assignments included: Cotter High School in Winona, Loyola High School in Mankato, and Shakopee Area Catholic School in Shakopee, during which time, she also served in school administration. From 2002-2011, she served as principal at San Miguel Middle School in Minneapolis. Sister Mary was then appointed as the coordinator of the Generalate House and Local Community in Rome, Italy, through the end of 2016. Last July, she began a new post as Dean of Student Achievement for Grades 10 and 11 at Cristo Rey Jesuit High School in Minneapolis. She holds a bachelor's in religious education from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee, a master's in theology and liturgy from St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota. Later, she earned her educational administrative licensure from Saint Mary's University of Minnesota.
