Sister Gladys devoted herself to Catholic grade school students throughout the majority of her active ministry years. Moving among schools throughout Minnesota and North Dakota, she served at a total of 12 schools between 1959 and 2004. Those in Minnesota included: St. Francis in St. Paul; Immaculate Conception in Lonsdale; St. Agnes in St. Paul; St. Stanislaus in Winona; St. Michael in St. Michael; and St. Mary in Madelia. North Dakota schools included: St. Peter and Paul in New Hradec; St. Mary in New England; Mandaree Public School; St. Bernard Indian Mission in Fort Yates; St. Therese Little Flower in Minot; and St. Joseph in Dickinson — all in the Diocese of Bismarck. Sister Gladys turned her attention to hospital chaplaincy, attending courses at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, then serving the sick for nearly a decade thereafter. From 2005-2007, she devoted herself to the patients at St. Alexius Hospital in Bismarck. Following this was eight years of full-time service as a chaplain at the Mayo Clinic. Since 2015, she has continued in part-time chaplaincy at CHI St. Alexius Health in Dickinson, North Dakota. Sister Gladys holds a bachelor's degree in elementary education from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. She later earned two masters' degrees — the first in reading education from the University of North Dakota, the second, in ministry from Seattle University.
