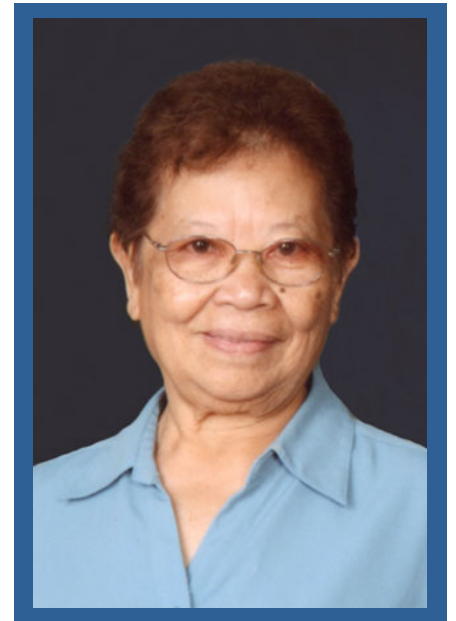

Sister Lydia Marie Borja, SSND

Sister Lydia Marie was born in 1934 in Guam. She made her first profession in 1958 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She returned to her home country, teaching elementary through high school students at Catholic schools across the Diocese of Agana Guam. Those schools included: Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Agat, San Vicente in Barrigada, St. Francis in Yona, and Notre Dame in Talofofo. From 1989-1993, Sister Lydia Marie ministered full-time in Rome at the SSND Generalate. Returning to San Vicente and St. Francis Schools, she held various teaching and administrative roles through the dawn of the new millennium. In 2000, she accepted a post as SHALOM Representative in Talofofo's Notre Dame Regional House, later serving there as a regional councilor and archivist. Sister Lydia Marie continued to teach during this era, returning to the classroom full-time from 2006-2010. She continues in part-time service at Notre Dame High School in Talofofo and still devotes time as a volunteer at St. Francis. She holds a bachelor's degree in social science from the University of Guam.
