Sister M. Jane Boos, SSND

Sister M. Jane completed her studies and moved to the classroom following her first profession in 1958. She taught third and fourth grade at Perpetual Help in St. Louis for one year and then was transferred to Helias High School in Jefferson City, Missouri, from 1961-1968, after which she returned to the St. Louis area. She served two years at Duchesne High School in St. Charles, followed by assignments in Illinois: Notre Dame High School in Quincy and St. Paul High School in Highland. After a year of study in theology and spirituality, Sister M. Jane served as Apostolic Director of Initial Formation from 1982-1987 at Our Lady of Angels Seminary in Quincy. Following three years as associate director with the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, she became Director of the Office for Social Concerns and Respect for Life in that diocese. Sister M. Jane held that full-time ministry for 28 years through 2015, after which she participated in a sabbatical at the Cannosian Spirituality Center in Albuquerque, New Mexico. She currently serves part-time in spiritual ministry at St. Anthony Memorial Hospital in Effingham, Illinois, where she resides in prayer and presence. Sister M. Jane holds a B.A. in Economics from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. In 1969 and 1989, she completed master's degrees: the first in business administration from the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana; the latter in pastoral studies from Loyola University in Chicago. In addition to her assigned ministries, Sister M. Jane served as assistant spiritual director for Teens Encounter Christ (TEC) and continues to serve on Cursillo as a spiritual director.
