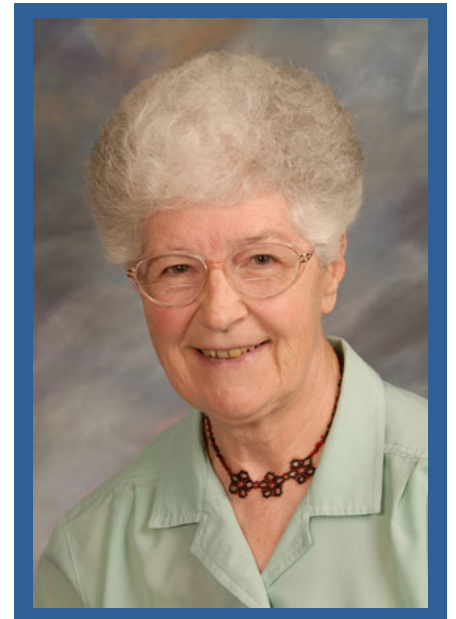

Sister Rosemary Schuneman, SSND

Sister Rosemary taught first and second grade in Minnesota and Iowa from 1958-1974. She taught sisters from Kenya, Africa at St. Francis Upgrading Center from 1975-79. In 1980, she began teaching English to adult refugees in St. Paul. In 1982, she founded the Notre Dame E.S.L. School located in the St. Paul Insurance Company. From 1994-2018, she continued teaching immigrants at Hubbs Center in St. Paul. Throughout the last 38 years, she also volunteered in various refugee programs. She was appointed to the Governor's Advisory Council for Refugees and was part of a state delegation to five refugee camps in Thailand. Sister Rosemary was a volunteer in Shakopee Women's Prison, Bayport Men's Prison and visited ICE detainees in Ramsey County for six years. In 2017, Sister Rosemary received the Good Counsel Alumnae Award for making a difference in the world around her. She has maintained joy and balance in her life through many years of square dancing. "When I dance I feel I hug the world."
