Sister Audrey Straub, SSND

Sister Audrey has devoted her ministry years to serving as a Catholic grade school teacher and administrator, and on staff with a diocesan marriage tribunal. Her earliest decades of teaching took her around Wisconsin, to St. Anne in Milwaukee, St. Peter and Paul in Wisconsin Rapids, and Christ the King in Wauwatosa — where she served throughout the 1950s. Following short assignments in the dioceses of Fort Wayne, Indiana, and Chicago, Sister Audrey returned to the La Crosse diocese as a teacher and administrator at St. Stephen in Stevens Point. She remained there from 1964-1969. She served for two years in administration at Notre Dame Health Care Center in Elm Grove, then she returned to elementary administration at Holy Angels in West Bend, through 1978. Sister Audrey then followed her call to Rockford, Illinois, serving over the next 25 years as a representative of its diocesan marriage tribunal. Returning to the Milwaukee area in 2005, Sister Audrey continued in prayerful service at Notre Dame of Elm Grove through 2012. She currently resides in presence and witness at Our Lady of the Angels in Greenfield. She holds a bachelor's degree in sociology from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. In 1969, she earned a master's degree in education administration from Milwaukee's Marquette University, and in 1985 was awarded a second degree in canon law from Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.
