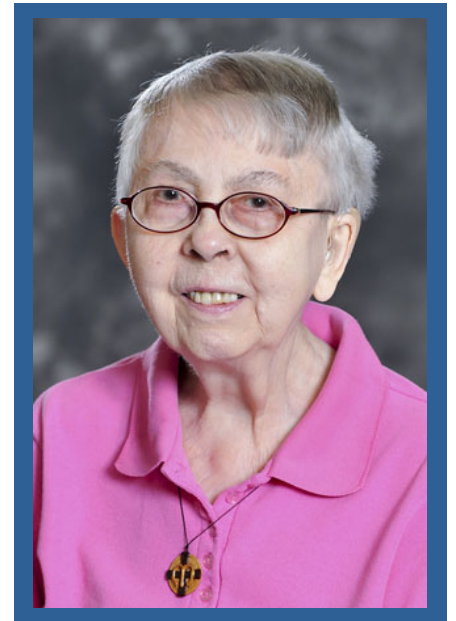

## **Sister Lillia Langreck, SSND**

*Sister Lillia has served as a teacher, RCIA director, and advocate for peace and justice. She taught at Alphonsus Catholic grade school in Chicago from 1946-1957, when she relocated to St. Francis in Milwaukee for a six-year assignment. From 1963-1974, Sister Mary Lillia taught middle school students at St. John Baptist in Marshfield, in the La Crosse diocese. For the next five years, she devoted herself to students with special needs at St. Anne in Milwaukee. Staying on at the parish, she moved into pastoral ministry through 1983. Sister Mary Lillia followed her call into literacy education, working as an English-as-a-Second-Language coordinator for Milwaukee Achiever Literacy from 1985-1994. Throughout the remainder of the millennium, she served in RCIA direction and other pastoral work at both St. Rose and St. Michael parishes in Milwaukee, remaining at St. Rose through 2006. She volunteered at Milwaukee's Shalom Community through 2010. Sister Mary Lillia has continued her work as a justice and peace advocate at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, where she has resided since 2012. She holds a bachelor's degree in English from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee.*
