Sister Mary Peter Eberhardy, SSND

Sister Mary Peter devoted her early ministry decades to teaching middle school students at Catholic grade schools across Wisconsin and in Chicago. She began at St. Leo in Milwaukee, serving from 1943-1949, followed by three years at All Saints in Chicago. The 1950s brought her home to the La Crosse area, where she served at: St. Peter and Paul in Wisconsin Rapids, as well as Our Lady of Peace and St. John the Baptist in Marshfield. From 1961-1966, Sister Mary Peter taught at St. Margaret of Scotland in Chicago. She rounded out the 1960s at St. Mary in Burlington and St. Agnes in Butler. She turned to elementary administration, serving over the next two decades at St. Aloysius in West Allis; Notre Dame in Chippewa Falls; and St. John Nepomucene in Prairie du Chien — her final assignment in education. Sister Mary Peter served as school secretary at Holy Assumption from 1989-1997. She then began devoting her time to volunteer ministries for sisters at Havenwood Nursing & Rehabilitation, St. Mary's, and Notre Dame of Elm Grove, where she currently resides in prayerful presence. Sister Mary Peter earned a bachelor's degree in history from Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. In 1967, she graduated from De Paul University in Chicago with a master's degree in elementary education.
