Sister Janet Gregorcich, SSND

Born in Milwaukee, *Sister Janet* Gregorcich entered the SSND novitiate in Mequon, Wisconsin, in 1968. Her earliest ministry assignments took her to Catholic grade schools: Holy Assumption in West Allis, Wisconsin, St. Adalbert in Grand Rapids, Michigan, and St. Francis Xavier in Superior, Wisconsin. In 1978, she began pastoral ministry in Raymond and Clara City, Minnesota, and five years at Sts. Peter and Paul in Huntington, Indiana. Sister Jan devoted the next 12 years to serving in pastoral roles in Guatemala in the parishes in Rio Bravo, Mixco, and Chinique, Quiche. After hurricane Mitch, Sister Jan volunteered at the Academia Madre Teresa Gerhardinger, and at the nutrition center Casa Carolina in Sulaco, Yoro, Honduras. On her return to the United States, Sister Jan helped establish Global Partners: Running Waters, Inc. (GPRW) whose mission is to build relationships through collaboration on water, food, health and education projects in Latin America. Sister Jan continues to work with GPRW and does pastoral ministry through the Interfaith Committee for Detained Immigrants in Kenosha and Dodge counties, Wisconsin. She earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee and holds a masters in spirituality and culture from Sophia Center at Holy Names College in Oakland, California.
