Sister Clare Marie Quichocho, SSND

Sister Clare Marie Quichocho was born in Agana, Guam. She made her first SSND profession in Milwaukee in 1959. She has devoted her decades of ministry in and around her home diocese in Guam. Nearly 30 of those years were spent at St. Francis Catholic School in Yona, Guam, where she first taught from 1960-1963, with later assignments spanning the ensuing decades. Between ministries at St. Francis, Sister Clare Marie taught at San Vincente Catholic School in Barrigada, Guam, as well as Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Agat, Guam. During the mid-1990s, she devoted two years of teaching in the Caroline Islands at St. Mary. In addition to holding several administrative positions at schools in the early 2000s, Sister Clare Marie also served the congregation as associate director of the Notre Dame Regional House in Talofofo, Guam. She continued teaching full-time through 2012. Since then, she has remained an active volunteer at both Carmel-on-the-Hill Retreat Center in Malojloj, Guam, and St. Francis School, where her decades of teaching first began. She earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education in 1972 from the University of Guam.
