Sister Georgiann Wildhaber, SSND

Sister Georgiann Wildhaber was born near St. Louis and made her first profession in 1959. Her first teaching assignment, from 1961-1969, took her to St. Clair, Missouri, where she served the middle school students at St. Clare. Following a two-year assignment at Sacred Heart in Lawrence, Nebraska, and St. Bernadette in St. Louis, Sister Georgiann devoted the next seven years to administration at St. Joseph Grade School in Manchester, Missouri. Beginning in 1980, she spent 10 years in adult education ministry, working from the Maria Center at Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis. Turning to secondary education administration, she served the last decade of the 2000s as administrator of Notre Dame High School in St. Louis, followed by four years as the school's president. Moving to Mississippi, Sister Georgiann accepted a post as facilities operation director at Chatawa's St. Mary of the Pines, a role she held through 2013. Since 2014, she has served as an educational consultant to elementary school principals in the diocese of Dallas, where she continues to volunteer in this capacity. Sister Georgiann earned a bachelor's degree in history from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis and holds a master's in elementary education administration from St. Louis University.
