Sister Kathryn Ann Kobelinski, SSND

Sister Kathryn Ann Kobelinski made her first profession in Milwaukee in 1959. During her first 12 years of ministry, she taught full-time around the diocese of Milwaukee, including the schools of St. Stanislaus, St. Vincent de Paul, and St. Aloysius in West Allis, Wisconsin. Moving to Menasha, Wisconsin, Sister Kathryn Ann devoted several years to the students at St. Patrick, followed by seven years in elementary administration at St. George in Kenosha, Wisconsin. From 1987-1991, she served the congregation as a provincial councilor. She served the Archdiocese of Milwaukee as an educational consultant and substitute teacher, then served at Spectrum Alternative High School in Milwaukee, in administration through 1995. Following a four-year assignment in teaching and staff development at Milwaukee's St. Joan Antida High School, Sister Kathryn Ann served on staff at the St. Francis Convent through 2013. She has since resided in prayerful presence at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin. She earned a bachelor's degree in biology from the former Mount Mary College in Milwaukee, and later earned masters' degrees in education and elementary administration from Murray State University, Kentucky, and the University of Wisconsin-Superior, respectively.
