Sister Miriam Jansen, SSND

Sister Miriam Jansen was born in St. Louis and entered the SSND novitiate at there 1959. She dedicated her earliest ministry years to teaching, serving at Catholic grade schools in Houma, Louisiana, and in the Midwest, including: Sacred Heart in Rich Fountain, Missouri; St. Martin in Jefferson City, Missouri; St. Augustine in Breese, Illinois; Immaculate Conception in West Alton, Missouri. From 1973-1979, Sister Miriam served the Diocese of Jefferson City, Missouri, as superintendent of schools. In 1979, she was elected provincial leader in St. Louis, concluding that ministry in 1987. From 1989-1992, she served as curriculum director for Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School in East St. Louis, Illinois. In the fall of 1992, Sister Miriam became director of international programs for the College of Notre Dame of Maryland in Baltimore, a role she held for nearly 20 years. Since 2011, she has continued in educational consulting while residing in Towson, Maryland. Sister Miriam holds a bachelor's degree in speech from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. In 1974, she earned a master's degree in elementary education from Ball State University in Indiana. In 1989, she completed a second master's degree focusing on global/international education from Harvard University in Massachusetts.
