Sister Dora Kipp, SSND

*Born in Marshfield, Wisconsin, **Sister Dora** Kipp made her first profession in Milwaukee in 1949. She has devoted herself to teaching Catholic grade school students throughout Wisconsin during the majority of her 60 plus years in active ministry. The longest of her earliest assignments took her to St. Anne in Milwaukee, where she taught from 1949-1963. She served seven years in teaching and administration at St. Mary in Glen Haven, Wisconsin, followed by five years at St. Leonard in Muskego, Wisconsin. Sister Dora accepted a leadership post as a local councilor, serving in Elm Grove, Wisconsin from 1977-1985. During the next several years, she cared for her parents in their home while teaching at Sacred Heart in Marshfield, Wisconsin. She accepted another seven-year leadership post as a local councilor in Mount Calvary, Wisconsin. In the early 2000s, she turned her attention to religious education, serving at St. Michael Parish in Hewitt, Wisconsin, as coordinator of religious education, a part-time ministry she continued through 2010. Sister Dora has continued in numerous volunteer services while residing at the SSND Residence in Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin. She completed a bachelor's degree in history at the former Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. She later earned a master's degree in elementary education administration from the University of Wisconsin.*
