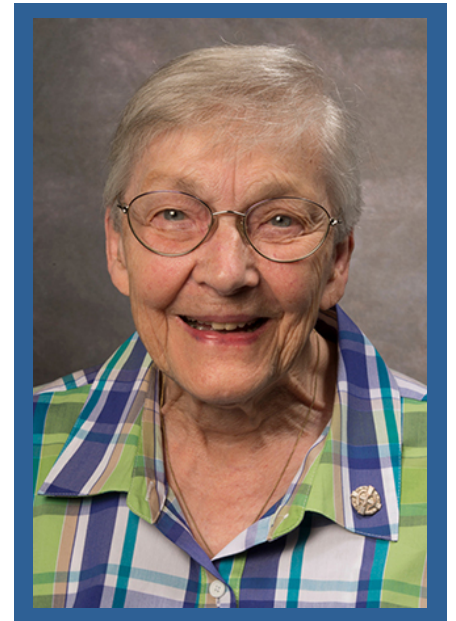

Sister Eleanor Francis Frankenberg, SSND

Sister Eleanor Francis Frankenberg was born in Marthasville, Missouri, and made her first profession in 1949 in St. Louis. Her initial teaching assignment at St. Francis Solanus Grade School in Quincy, Illinois, lasted 14 years, from 1949-1963. The next decade took her to St. Francis in Aviston, Illinois, followed by St. Francis of Assisi in Teutopolis, Illinois. Sister Eleanor Francis spent most of the following 10 years teaching Catholic grade school students in Los Angeles and San Diego. She served at St. Joseph Grade School in Cairo, Illinois, from 1986-1990, then moved to the diocese of Venice, Florida, where she served in pastoral ministry at St. Raphael in Englewood, Florida. Beginning in the late 1990s, she continued in volunteer ministries and adult education, serving migrant workers in Immokalee, Florida, until returning to St. Louis in 2007, where she continues to reside in prayerful presence and volunteer ministries at Theresa Center. Sister Eleanor Francis earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis, followed by a master's degree in education from St. Louis University.
