Sister Rosalyce Tinglof, SSND

Sister Rosalyce Tinglof was born in Milwaukee and made her first profession there in 1949. The first 10 years were served as a Catholic grade school teacher in her hometown, at Holy Cross and St. Elizabeth schools. From 1959-1966, she taught at St. Stephen in Stevens Point, Wisconsin, followed by eight years at St. Leo, back in Milwaukee. Sister Rosalyce cared for her parents in their home from 1976-1978. She then returned to classrooms around Milwaukee. She taught for the next seven years at Mary Queen of Heaven; three years at St. Mary in Port Washington; and nine years at St. Mary in Random Lake. From 1997-2003, she volunteered in nursing home ministry and prayerful presence while residing at the SSND residence in Franklin. Since 2010, she has continued her prayer ministry at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Wisconsin. Sister Rosalyce earned a bachelor's degree in education from the former Mount Mary College in Milwaukee. In 1973, she completed a master's degree in education-counseling/guidance from Marquette University, also in Milwaukee.
