Sister William Ann Heidenfelder was born and raised in St. Louis. She made her first profession in 1949, and devoted herself to teaching Catholic grade school students across the St. Louis greater metropolitan area for more than 35 years. Early assignments included: St. Michael in Radom, Illinois; followed by 15 years at St. Joseph in Farmington, Illinois. Beginning in the late 1960s, Sister William Ann served at St. John Nepomuk in St. Louis; Blessed Sacrament in Hannibal, Missouri; St. Barbara, St. Engelbert, Compton Heights and St. Martin of Tours, all in St. Louis. In 1986, she undertook a new ministry, working for the next two decades with the elderly at All Souls Parish in St. Louis. Since 2006, she has resided in prayerful presence while continuing to volunteer around St. Louis. Sister William Ann holds a bachelor's degree in art from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis.
