Sister Beth Haltiner, SSND

Born in St. Paul, Minnesota, *Sister Beth* Haltiner made her first profession in Mankato, Minnesota, in 1944. She has devoted her entire ministry to teaching Catholic grade school and high school students. Early assignments took her to St. Stanislaus in Winona, Minnesota, St. John in Mankato, Minnesota, and St. Francis de Sales in her hometown of St. Paul, Minnesota. Sister Beth followed her call to North Dakota and Washington, serving at two schools from 1952-1955. Back in Minnesota, she returned to St. Stanislaus for a year, then taught at St. Agnes in St. Paul, Minnesota, and Loyola High School in Mankato, Minnesota, where she stayed through 1967. Sister Beth accepted a five-year position in religious education for the catechetical program at St. Bonaventure parish in Bloomington, Minnesota. She continued in religious education throughout the late 1970s and 1980s, serving at Mary, Mother of the Church in Burnsville, Minnesota, Sacred Heart in St. Paul, Minnesota, and Sacred Heart in Sauk Rapids, Minnesota. Sister Beth spent five years working as a tutor for the Guadalupe Area Project in St. Paul, Minnesota. Since 1998, she has lived and served in prayerful witness at Our Lady of Good Counsel in Mankato, Minnesota. She holds a bachelor's degree in English from the College of St. Catherine in St. Paul, Minnesota. She later earned two masters' degrees; the first in English from the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana, and the second in religious education from Chicago's Loyola University.
