Sister Margaret Berghold, SSND

Sister Margaret Berghold hails from St. Louis and made her first profession there in 1944. She began her teaching ministry at numerous Catholic grade schools and high schools around the region, including St. Peter in Belleville, Illinois, Rosati-Kain in St. Louis, St. Joseph in Cairo, Illinois and St. Alphonsus Rock in St. Louis. Sister Margaret taught in New Orleans at Sacred Heart High School from 1960-1966. Returning to St. Louis, she taught at the former Notre Dame College until 1978, when she turned her attention to serving as a spiritual director through the mid-1980s. She then served in various administrative and secretarial roles in St. Louis. Those sites include Cardinal Ritter Institute, Our Lady of Life Apartments, and at the Sancta Maria in Ripa, where she worked and lived until 2011. Sister Margaret resided at Therese Center through 2017, when she moved to the Sarah Community in Bridgeton, Missouri. She earned a bachelor's degree in history from the former Le Clerc College in Belleville, Illinois. In 1956, she completed a master's degree in education at St. Louis University.
