Sister Kathleen Wegman, SSND

Sister Kathleen was born in Jefferson City, Missouri. She made her first profession in 1969 in St. Louis. She devoted her first seven years of ministry as an elementary school teacher and administrator at Sacred Heart in Effingham, Illinois. She continued as administrator at St. Francis Borgia Grade School in Washington, Missouri from 1978 to 1981. Sister Kathleen followed her call to several leadership roles, serving the Archdiocese of St. Louis as associate superintendent of schools for two years, followed by 16 years' service to the former St. Louis Province as a provincial councilor from 1983 through 1991 and provincial from 1991 to 1999. She returned to elementary education administration from 2000 to 2002 at St. James in Decatur, Illinois, then served for three years at Queen of Peace in Belleville, Illinois. In 2007, she moved back to her hometown to accept a new ministry serving the Diocese of Jefferson City as Chancellor until 2019. For several months, she was the director of pastoral and charitable services; she retired from this position in November 2019. She holds a bachelor's degree in social science from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. In 1980, she completed a master's degree in elementary administration at Clarke College in Dubuque, Iowa.
