Sister Linda was born in Washington, Missouri, and made her first profession in 1960 in St. Louis. She spent 58 years as a classroom teacher in Catholic grade schools across Missouri, Illinois and greater St. Louis. Her first assignment was at St. Stephen in Caseyville, Illinois, a three-year post concluding in 1964. Following three years at St. Joseph in Westphalia, Missouri, Sister Linda relocated to St. Charles, Missouri, teaching through 1971 at St. Peter school. From 1971 to 1978, she served at St. Charles in DuBois, Illinois, followed by five years at St. Joseph in Ridgway, Illinois, both towns in the Diocese of Belleville, Illinois. Sister Linda's final teaching assignment lasted 33 years at Holy Family in Freeburg, Missouri. She continues in teaching and volunteer services there. She holds a bachelor's degree in history from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. In 1976, she completed a master's degree in reading education from Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau.
