Sister Marie Regine was born in Marshfield, Wisconsin. She made her first profession in 1950 in Milwaukee. Her many years of ministry included roles as a grade school teacher, administrator, spiritual/retreat director and administrator in adult continuing education. From 1950 through 1973, her teaching and administrative roles took her to the following schools: St. Helena of the Cross and St. Alphonsus in Chicago, Illinois; Blessed Sacrament in Morton, Illinois; SS. Peter and Paul in Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin; St. Gabriel in Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin, and St. Philip in Rudolph, Wisconsin. Sister Marie Regine then served two years as SSND Area Coordinator in the LaCrosse and Superior dioceses in Wisconsin. After a sabbatical in spiritual leadership through Loyola University in Chicago, she devoted herself to retreat and spiritual direction, as well as formation director for the temporary professed, along with ongoing formation for the congregation, ministries which continued until 1987. She began a part-time ministry in adult education at Mount Mary College (now University), a role that lasted 15 years, while continuing as a retreat/spiritual director. Since the early 2000s, Sister Marie Regine has continued to assist individuals seeking spiritual direction. From her home at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, Wisconsin, she currently volunteers in part-time ministries at Elmbrook Memorial Hospital and Blessed Savior Parish in Milwaukee. Sister Marie Regine earned a bachelor's degree in English from Mount Mary College (now University) in Milwaukee and a master's degree in religious education from the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana.
