Sister Theresa Marie Dietz, SSND

Sister Theresa Marie was born and raised in St. Louis. She made her first profession there in 1950. She has dedicated her decades of ministry as a teacher and artist. She taught middle and high school students for over 40 years, with early assignments at St. Peter in Belleville, Illinois; St. Francis De Sales in St. Louis; Notre Dame High School in Quincy, Illinois, and nine years at St. Mary of the Pines High School in Chatawa, Mississippi. From 1969 through 1975, Sister Theresa Marie taught at St. Gerard Regional High School in San Antonio, Texas, followed by eight years at Sacred Heart in Morrilton, Arkansas. Her final classroom assignment took her to Tucson, Arizona, where she taught at Salpointe High School through 2002. Relocating to St. Mary of the Pines, Chatawa, Mississippi, she took up new ministries as an accounting clerk, artist, staff assistant and computer specialist. Sister Theresa Marie continues in prayerful presence at St. Anthony's Gardens in Covington, Louisiana. She holds a bachelor's degree in art from the former Notre Dame College in St. Louis. In 1963, she completed a master's degree in art at the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana.
