

Sister Margie Weyers, SSND

Sister Margie was born in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and in 1978, earned a bachelor's degree in early childhood education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. In 1981, she made first profession in Mequon, Wisconsin. Sister Margie devoted the first nine years of her ministry to early childhood education, beginning in 1981, as a kindergarten teacher at St. Anne, Milwaukee, and later teaching at Holy Angels, West Bend, Wisconsin. She returned to Milwaukee in 1989, to serve as a childcare worker at Marquette University and in 1990, as an early childhood teacher at Silver Spring Neighborhood Center. From 1990 to 1992, Sister Margie worked for First Security Credit Union and Wisconsin Printing Industries, both in Elm Grove, Wisconsin. She served in local leadership at the Marian Catholic Center in Milwaukee from 1992 to 1994. She worked as a receptionist for Mahler Enterprises, Inc., Milwaukee, and then returned to First Security Credit Union, also working as a receptionist. In 1996, Sister Margie went back to the classroom where she served as a kindergarten teacher at Providence Catholic School, Union Grove, Wisconsin. After returning from a sabbatical in 2002, Sister Margie was a non-medical caregiver for Home Instead in Appleton, Wisconsin. From 2003 to 2008, she served as a faith formation coordinator for first through fifth grades at St. Pius X, also in Appleton. Beginning in 2009, Sister Margie returned again to Milwaukee where she served as a teacher at the Child Development Center of St. Joseph and at the Guardian Angel Learning Center. Since 2012, she has served at Notre Dame of Elm Grove, Elm Grove, first as transportation coordinator and currently, as a community leader.
