Sister Carol was born in Marshfield, Wisconsin, and in 1961, made first profession in Mequon, Wisconsin. She has remained in Wisconsin throughout her entire ministry, beginning in 1963 at SS. Peter and Paul, Wisconsin Rapids. After teaching at SS. Peter and Paul for two years, Sister Carol went to St. Dominic in Brookfield, remaining there until 1966. She then went to St. Joseph, Appleton, where she taught for six years. During this time, she earned a bachelor's degree in social science from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. From 1972 to 1975, she taught at Sacred Heart, Appleton. While at Sacred Heart, she received a master's degree in education from St. Francis College, Fort Wayne, Indiana. She went to western Wisconsin in 1975, teaching and serving as administrator at St. Joseph, Black River Falls. She served as administrator from 1978 to 1982 at St. John Nepomucene, Prairie du Chien, and from 1982 to 1998 at Sacred Heart, Marshfield. After spending time caring for her parents, Sister Carol served as administrator at St. Anthony School, Loyal. Since 2012, she has been in Wisconsin Rapids, serving in prayer and presence, and in volunteer ministry.
