Her first teaching assignment was at St. Peter Grade School, Jefferson City, Missouri, where she taught for two years. She then taught at two schools in St. Louis, St. Engelbert from 1965 to 1967, and Our Lady of Sorrows from 1967 to 1971. She then went to Illinois, teaching first at Sacred Heart, DuQuoin, and then at St. Mary, Alton. She earned a master's degree in elementary education from Southern Illinois University Edwardsville in 1975. In 1982, Sister Doris Jean became administrator at St. William, St. Louis, and remained there until 1991. She was a parttime member of the clerical staff at St. Stephen,



Caseyville, Illinois, and a part-time member of the finance staff at Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School, East St. Louis, Illinois, serving in both ministries for one year. From 1992 to 2003, Sister Doris Jean was a teacher at Sister Thea Bowman School. Since 2004, she has been serving as parish secretary at St. James Church, Millstadt, Illinois.
