Sister Jean Ann Weyer, SSND

Sister Jean Ann was born in Washington, Missouri, and made first profession in St. Louis in 1951. Her first ministry was at St. Gabriel the Archangel, St. Louis, where she taught until 1953. She then went to St. Barbara, St. Louis, teaching intermediate level students until 1955. In 1956, Sister Jean Ann received a bachelor's degree in biology from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis, and in 1968, a master's degree in secondary education from St. Louis University, St. Louis. From the mid-1950s to the early 1980s, she served in Missouri schools, teaching at St. Francis Borgia, Washington; Notre Dame High School, St. Louis; Cape Catholic High School, Cape Girardeau; and Rosary High School, St. Louis. From 1982 to 2003, she was an alternative education teacher at Vincent Gray Alternative High School, East St. Louis, Illinois, and ministered to women at New Life Style Program, St. Louis. Beginning in 2003, she tutored at Notre Dame Tutorial Center, St. Louis, until 2007, and then taught at Notre Dame Learning Center, St. Louis, until 2009. Currently, Sister Jean Ann is teaching for the Immigrant and Refugee Women's Program, St. Louis.
