Sister Lisette was born in Brussels, Illinois, and in 1951, made first profession in St. Louis. She has remained in Missouri throughout her ministry, which began in 1951 teaching at Our Lady of Perpetual Help, St. Louis. She received a bachelor's degree in elementary education from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis, in 1957. After teaching at Our Lady of Perpetual Help for 14 years, she went to St. Joseph, Manchester, where she taught until 1972. During this time, Sister Lisette received a master's degree in elementary education administration from St. Louis University. She then taught at Sacred Heart, Eureka, from 1972 to 1981; Notre Dame Elementary School, St. Louis, from 1981 to 1993; and St. Andrew, St. Louis, from 1993 to 2003. She then served as a driver for sisters until 2015. Sister Lisette is currently engaged as a volunteer, and resides in prayer and presence at Sancta Maria in Ripa, St. Louis.
