Sister Margaret Ann is originally from St. Louis and made first profession there in 1951. That same year, she began her ministry, teaching at St. Francis Solanus, Quincy, Illinois. She taught at St. Francis Solanus until 1962 and then went to St. Francis Borgia, Washington, Missouri. She received a bachelor's degree in history from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis, in 1963. After teaching at St. Francis Borgia for four years, Sister Margaret Ann taught for three years at Rosati-Kain High School, St. Louis, and from 1969 to 1979, at Rosary High School, St. Louis. During this period, she received a master's degree in political science and government from the University of Notre Dame, South Bend, Indiana, and a master's degree in social studies education from Washington University, St. Louis. In 1979, she became administrator at Rosati-Kain High School, serving in this capacity until 1985. Until 2012, she taught at DeSmet Jesuit High School, St. Louis, and most recently has been engaged in volunteer work at various locations throughout St. Louis.
