Sister Rose Miriam Wegman, SSND

Sister Rose Miriam is originally from Jefferson City, Missouri, and in 1951, made first profession in St. Louis. Her first teaching ministry was at Our Lady of Sorrows, St. Louis, where she served until 1955. That same year, she received a bachelor's degree in English from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis. After receiving her degree, Sister Rose Miriam went to St. Mary's Assumption, New Orleans, where she taught for four years. She returned to Missouri where she taught at Duchesne High School, St. Charles, until 1961, and then became the school's administrator. In 1962, she received a master's degree in English from Xavier University, Xavier, Louisiana. She served as administrator at Duchesne High School until 1964, and then as associate superintendent for the Archdiocese of St. Louis. In 1969, she received a master's degree in secondary education administration from St. Louis University, St. Louis. She was elected to the provincial council for the former St. Louis province in 1971, and served an eight-year term. Sister Rose Miriam began the 1980s as treasurer at the Generalate in Rome, returning to the United States to serve as director of development at St. Peter, Belleville, Illinois, for five years. From the mid-1990s to the mid-2010s, she was in St. Louis, serving as the elderly facility administrator at DuBourg Hall, as a member of the finance staff at Notre Dame High School, in community service at Sancta Maria in Ripa and as secretary at the former Notre Dame Preschool. Sister Rose Miriam is now serving in prayer and presence at Anna House, The Sarah Community, Bridgeton, Missouri.
