Sister Judith Marie Jung, SSND

Sister Judith Marie is originally from St. Louis and made first profession there in 1946. She began her ministry that same year, teaching at St. George, Linn, Missouri. After teaching at St. George for five years, she taught at St. Mary's Assumption, New Orleans, remaining there until 1955. She received a bachelor's degree in English that year from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis, and then went to Corpus Christi, Texas, teaching at Christ the King School. From 1959 to 1965, she served as teacher and administrator at St. Joseph, Freeburg, Illinois. During this time, Sister Judith Marie received a master's degree in elementary education from Incarnate Word College, San Antonio. From the mid-1960s to the mid-1980s, she taught in Missouri schools, including Immaculate Heart of Mary, St. Louis; St. Joseph, Manchester; and Our Lady of Lourdes, Washington. In 1986, she returned to St. Joseph, Freeburg, teaching elementary students until 1992. After retiring, Sister Judith Marie returned to St. Louis, engaging in community service at Villa Gesu, volunteering at Our Lady of Loretto and Village North Health Care, and serving as a volunteer librarian at St. John Neumann School. She is currently serving in prayer and presence at Anna House, The Sarah Community, Bridgeton, Missouri.
