Sister Luella Zollar, SSND

Sister Luella is originally from Wilton, North Dakota, and made first profession in Mankato, Minnesota, in 1946. From the mid-1940s and throughout the 1950s, she taught at St. John Cantius, Wilno, Minnesota; Sacred Heart, Eden, South Dakota; St. Adalbert, Silver Lake, Minnesota; St. Joseph, Grenville, South Dakota; and St. Wenceslaus, Dickinson, North Dakota. In 1959, she received a bachelor's degree in education from Mount Mary College (now University), Milwaukee. From 1960 to 1973, Sister Luella was the director of religious education at Christ the King, Medford, Minnesota; St. Theresa, Mapleton, Minnesota; and Immaculate Conception, Forsyth, Montana. She then served as a religious education teacher at St. John the Evangelist, Baker, Montana, until 1996. Since 2002, Sister Luella has been at Our Lady of Good Counsel, Mankato, Minnesota, first engaged in community service and now residing in prayer and presence.
