Sister Sharon Rempe, SSND

Sister Sharon was born in Hebron, Nebraska, and in 1946, made first profession in St. Louis. She began her ministry that same year, teaching at St. Gerard Majella, San Antonio, until 1951. At that time, she earned a bachelor's degree in history from Incarnate Word College, San Antonio, and then went on to Rosati-Kain High School, St. Louis, teaching there until 1960. While at Rosati-Kain, she received a master's degree in home economics education from St. Louis University. During the 1960s, Sister Sharon taught at Carmel High School, Houston; St. Paul High School, Santa Fe Spring, California; and Rosary High School, St. Louis. She was a counselor throughout the 1970s and 1980s at Notre Dame High School, Quincy, Illinois; St. Francis Borgia, Washington, Missouri; and St. Anthony High School, Effingham, Illinois. She then returned to Rosary High School as a development staff member. From 1996 to 2014, Sister Sharon volunteered at Our Lady of Loretto, Rosary High School, St. Aloysius, St. John Neumann School, Trinity Catholic High School, and Christ Light of the Nations School, all in St. Louis, and at Notre Dame High School, Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Since 2014, she has been serving in prayer and presence and currently resides at Anna House, The Sarah Community, Bridgeton, Missouri.
