Sister Guadalupe Valdez is originally from San Diego, California, and in 1972 professed first vows in St. Louis. She received a bachelor's degree in American studies from the former Notre Dame College, St. Louis in 1973. She spent the early years of her ministry teaching in California schools, including Holy Family, St. Jude Academy and St. Rita, all in San Diego. For two years, she taught at St. Bernadette, St. Louis before returning to California to teach for three years at St. Hilary, Pico Rivera. From 1986 to 1989 she was a member of the clerical staff at Bishop Conaty High School, Los Angeles, and then spent nine years as a teacher, academic counselor and clerical staff member at St. Paul High School, Santa Fe Springs, California. She returned to the now merged Bishop Conaty/Our Lady of Loretto High School, Los Angeles, and served as an academic counselor and staff member for 14 years. During this time Sister Guadalupe received a master's degree in instructional technology from Grand Canyon University, Phoenix. Recently, Sister Guadalupe served as co-director of associates of the School Sisters of Notre Dame Central Pacific Province while living in Chula Vista, California. She is now engaged in volunteer services while in ministry discernment.
