Sister Julie Brady is a native of Tampa, Florida, and in 1970, received a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Dallas. She made first profession in Dallas in 1972, and began teaching at Redemptorist High School, New Orleans. She taught at Redemptorist until 1976, and then went to Thomas K. Gorman High School, Tyler, Texas, teaching there until 1979. That same year, Sister Julie received a master's degree in English from the University of Dallas. She then went to Redemptorist Senior High School, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where she taught for three years. In 1982, she was named vocations director for the former Dallas Province. After serving for five years, Sister Julie taught for two years as Resurrection High School, Pascogoula, Mississippi. She then went to Africa and spent the next seven years teaching at Notre Dame Girls' Senior High School, Sunyani, Ghana. After spending a year back in the United States studying religious formation at St. Louis University, St. Louis, Sister Julie went back to Sunyani, Ghana. She served as initial formation director for the School Sisters of Notre Dame from 1997 to 1999, and then teaching again at Notre Dame Girls' Senior High School for one year. When she returned to the United States, she spent 2000 to 2002 engaged in
